


Charmed Reborn

Procedures

To Purify an Ingested Curse

(Entry handwritten by unknown hand, presumably Grace Warren)
One requires the assistance of a Witch Doctor. First, the patient must be enveloped with the Light of Osain, which is only created by a Witch Doctor of high degree. In certain cases, it is required to open the patient's chakras with the appropriate talisman (invoking deities or forces opposite to the given ailment).

However, the most important step is the pellet which must be ingested by the patient after purification by the Light of Osain. Mix Grass of Osain with cinnamon. This must be ground together with mortar and pestle in combination with the appropriate flowers and herbs. (Note written by Lucile Russel: Morning Glory good for sleeping curses). Roll the resulting herbs into pellets, and make the patient swallow one, two if necessary.

To Create a Garnet Cage

(Entry handwritten by unknown hand, presumably Beatrice Warren)
A crystal cage. Requires four garnet crystals placed at the four quarters. A basic frame, utilizes the element of fire to encage a target. This root of fire can then be elaborated on with the combination of other crystals:

Sunstone- Helios' Flare of Purging surges through the cage.

Fire Opal- Helios' Flare of Dazzling surges through the cage.
Rock crystal- Augments the strength of the cage, lining it with fire.

Brianna Warren

(Entry Handwritten by unknown hand, presumably Laura, Grace, or Beatrice Warren)

Brianna was the oldest of her sisters, who mastered the gift of telekinesis. She resided in Crimea, Ukraine, during the Crimean War, where she helped fight the demonic Lords of War. Her greatest conquest was when she separated Lord Gabrielle from his crystal sword, by using her telekinesis to throw it hundreds of miles away. She married the aristocrat August Stillman, and had two children: Emil and Sylvia. Unfortunately, upon the deaths of Brianna and August, their whereabouts are unknown.

Astrid Warren

(Entry Handwritten by unknown hand, presumably Laura, Grace, or Beatrice Warren)

Astrid was the middle of her sisters, who mastered the gift of molecular immobilization. She resided in Japan, and was present when Matthew Perry attempted to open Japan to foreign trade. Astrid and the coven she joined attempted to defend Edo from the military ships Perry sent out, but their attempt failed due to an as-of-yet unknown magical party that Perry brought along himself. Astrid, unlike her two sisters, did not marry, remaining a bachelorette her whole life.

Helena Warren

(Entry Handwritten by unknown hand, presumably Laura, Grace, or Beatrice Warren)

Helena was the youngest of her sisters, who mastered the gift of premonition. She arrived in San Francisco in lieu of the California Gold Rush, the only one of her sisters to have stayed on the American continent. Her power of foresight allowed her and her lover, David, to be far more successful than other miners, and by the time the Elders stopped her for personal gain, she was rich enough to settle down permanently. Personal Gain later struck back, killing David.

The Stillman Brothers

(Entry Handwritten by Phoebe Halliwell)

Oni

(Entry handwritten by unknown hand, but presumably Astrid Warren)

Oni are goblin-like demons that spread bad luck. The most common demon in Japan besides tengu, Oni normally pose very little threat and can be repelled with proper charms by a priest or priestess. However, Oni also come in a very wide variety; some variations are particularly more savage, taking pleasure in devouring their victims. Note that Oni can never enter a household unless invited.

Although some dragons are benevolent creatures, However mighty the Dragon Warlock is, he can be defeated with the basic Power of Three spell.

Ryus

(Entry handwritten by unknown hand, but presumably Astrid Warren)

Ryus. Water dragons, usually benevolent, with the power to control storms. When angered they attack with bolts of lightning. One of the most mysterious of dragons, said to live as much in this world as the dream world.

(Entry expanded by Lex Russel)

Ryus, along with the power of flight, can also manipulate fire, wind, water, and lightning. Ryus are heavily connected with the dream world; when they are awake in the dream world, they are asleep in the waking world. The dream world has different mechanics than the waking world; regular magic has no effect, but Ryus can effectively utilize their abilities as well as they can in the waking world.

The Elephant Man

(Entry handwritten by Lucille Russel; the closest entry she could find to Lex Russel's description of his assailant)

A mysterious ally of good, also named the White Elephant by oral tradition. Often times associated with the dream world, the Elephant Man visits dreams of exceptionally good people, consuming their nightmares and replacing them with pleasant sleep.

Devour Demons

(Entry handwritten by unknown hand, presumably Astrid Warren)

Demons who dwell in shadows, and prey on the souls of good beings. Can be summoned by a potion of verain, nightshade, holly, and dried oak leaves. Slivers of night.

(Entry expanded by unknown hand, scrawled and messy)

There was once a seamstress in a faraway land. Her daughter was the most beautiful girl in the village, and the seamstress grew obsessed with her daughter's beauty. As her mouth shut, hoping that her spirit would leave her body, and she would fade away. In a bout of fear, the seamstress killed her daughter. She stiched with her rage and hate which could not escape from the stiched shut mouth, and, to this day, it is said she roams the earth. As a hoolyless demon, searching for the most abandoned her.

The Yuki-Onna

(Entry handwritten by unknown hand, a presumably Astrid Warren)

A figure in white, with long black hair, and a pale face. She can turn invisible in a snow storm. To banish the Yuki-Onna, one must thaw her heart.
